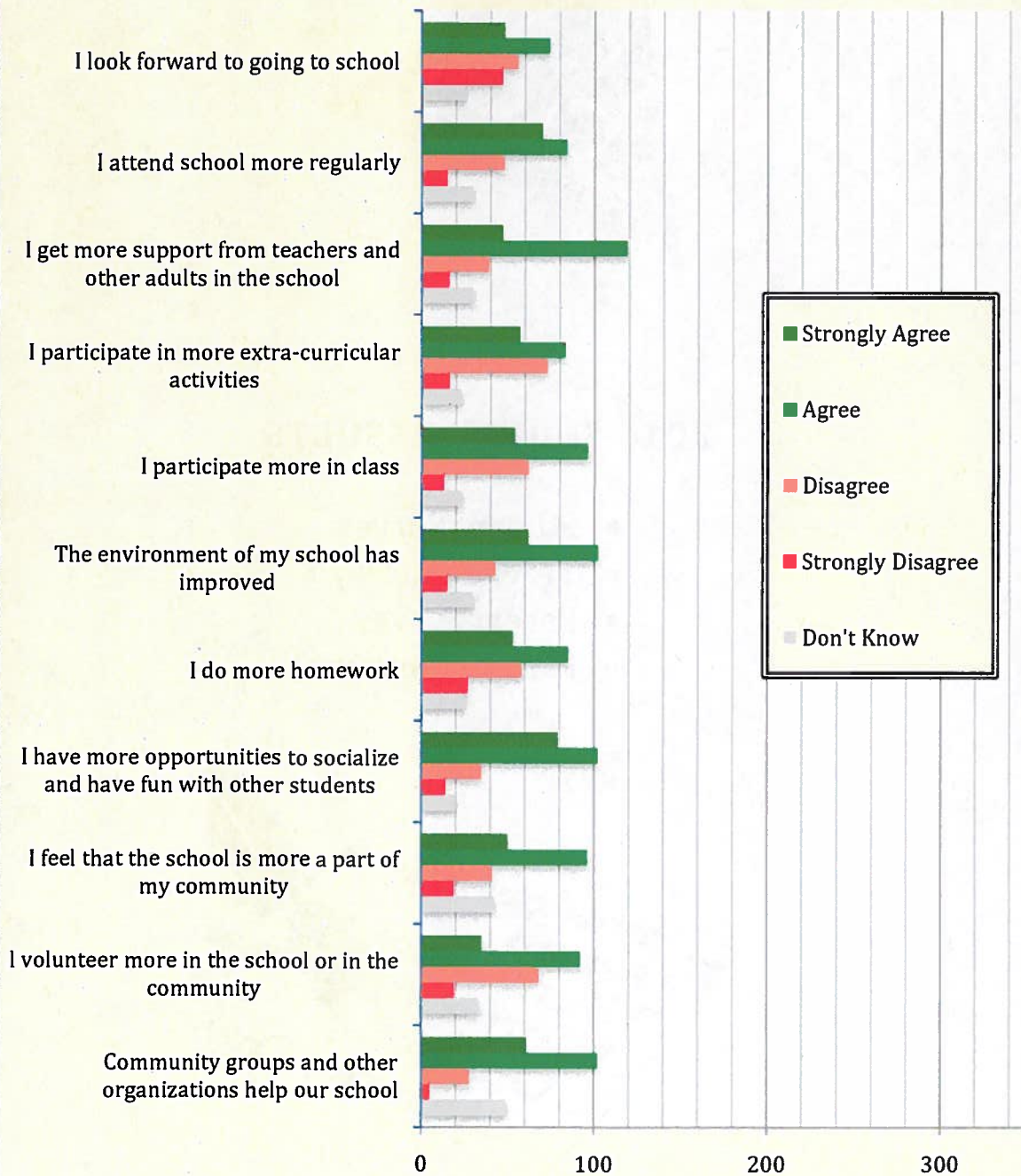


Community Learning Centres Student Survey

What do you like about your school now that it is a CLC?

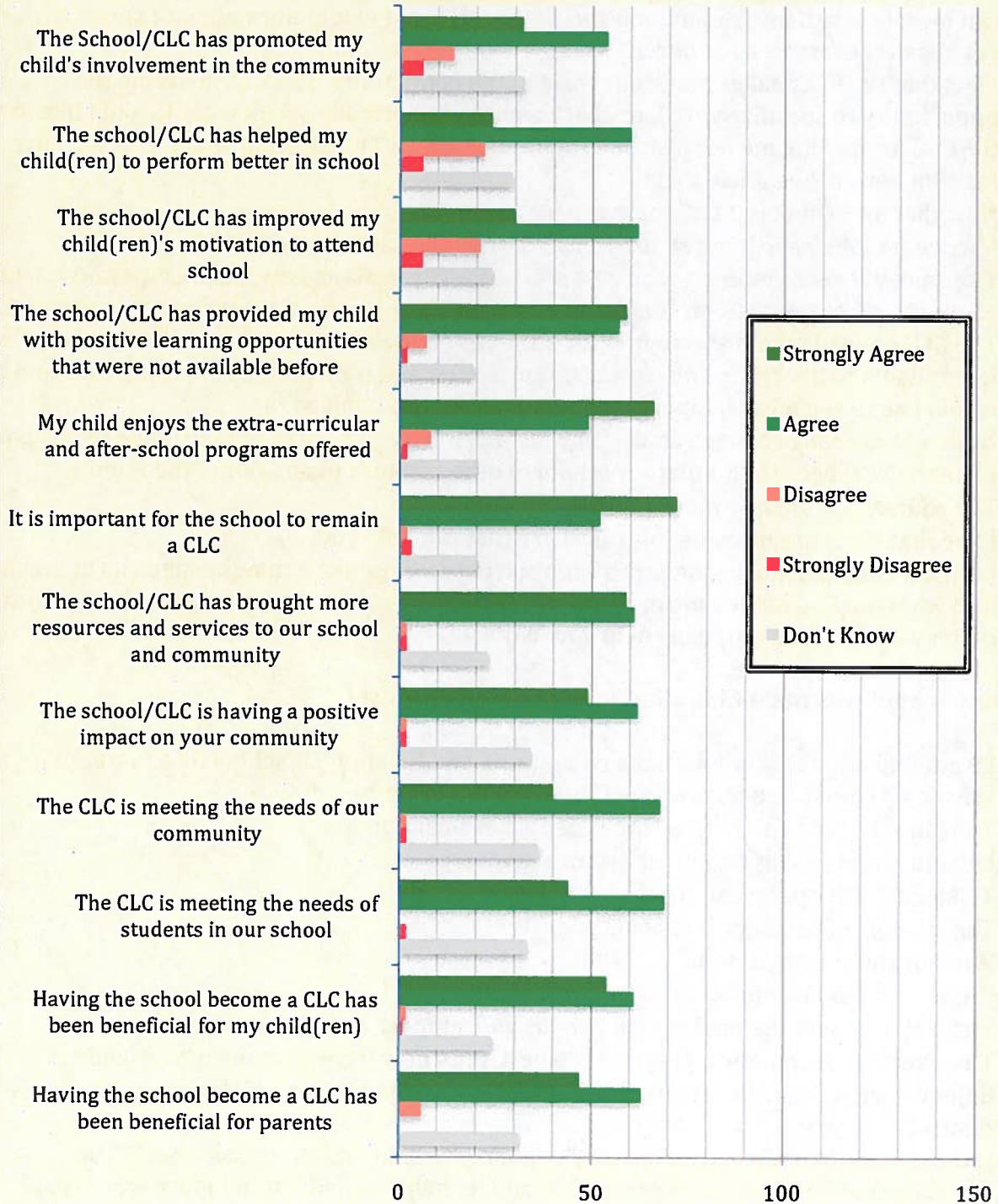

Is there anything that you would add about the impact of the school/CLC on your child(ren)?

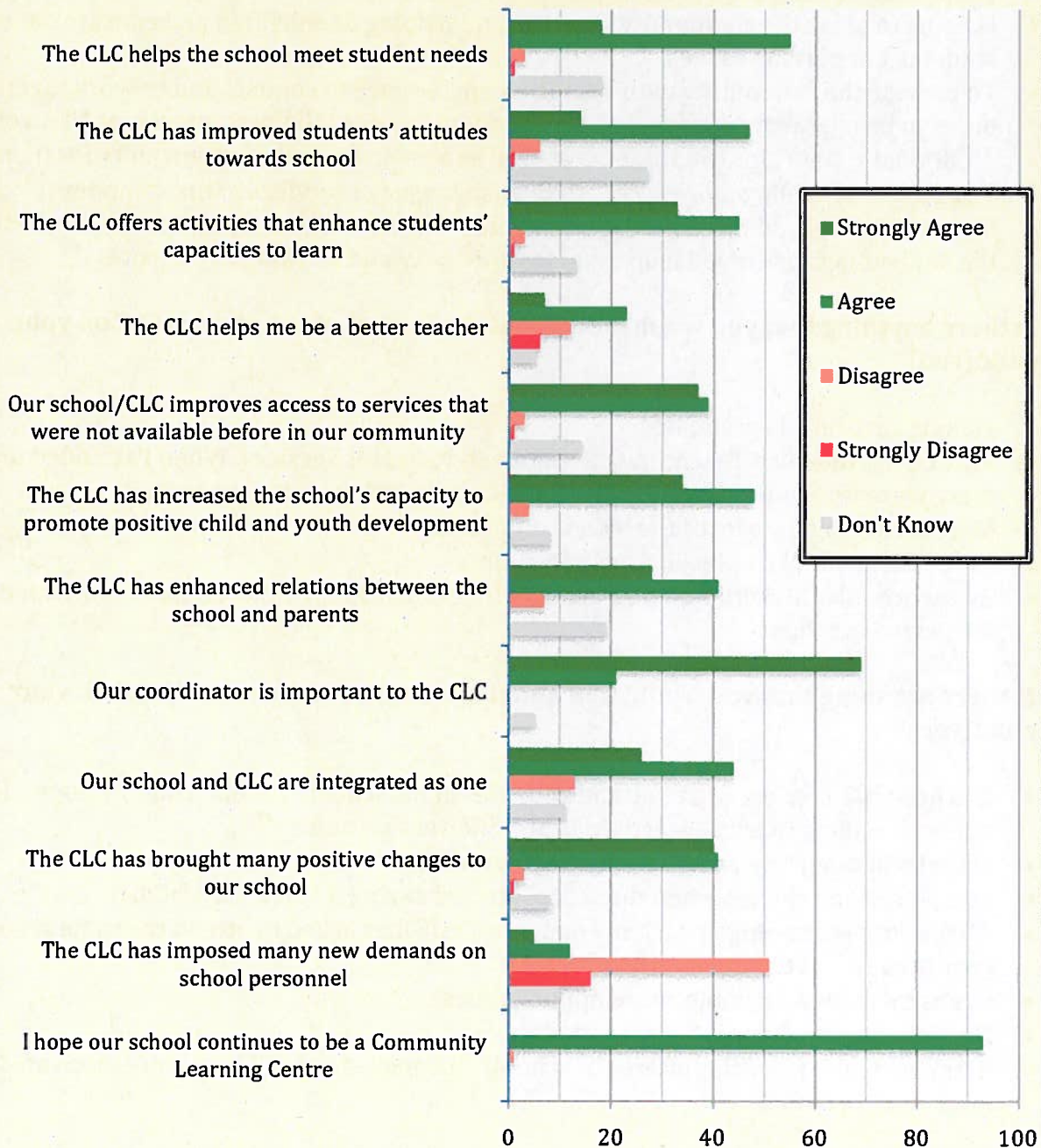
- It is important for my son to attend activities in his school. It is his "comfort-zone". He would not be as willing to try new activities in a different setting.

How has the CLC changed your role (or work) in the school?

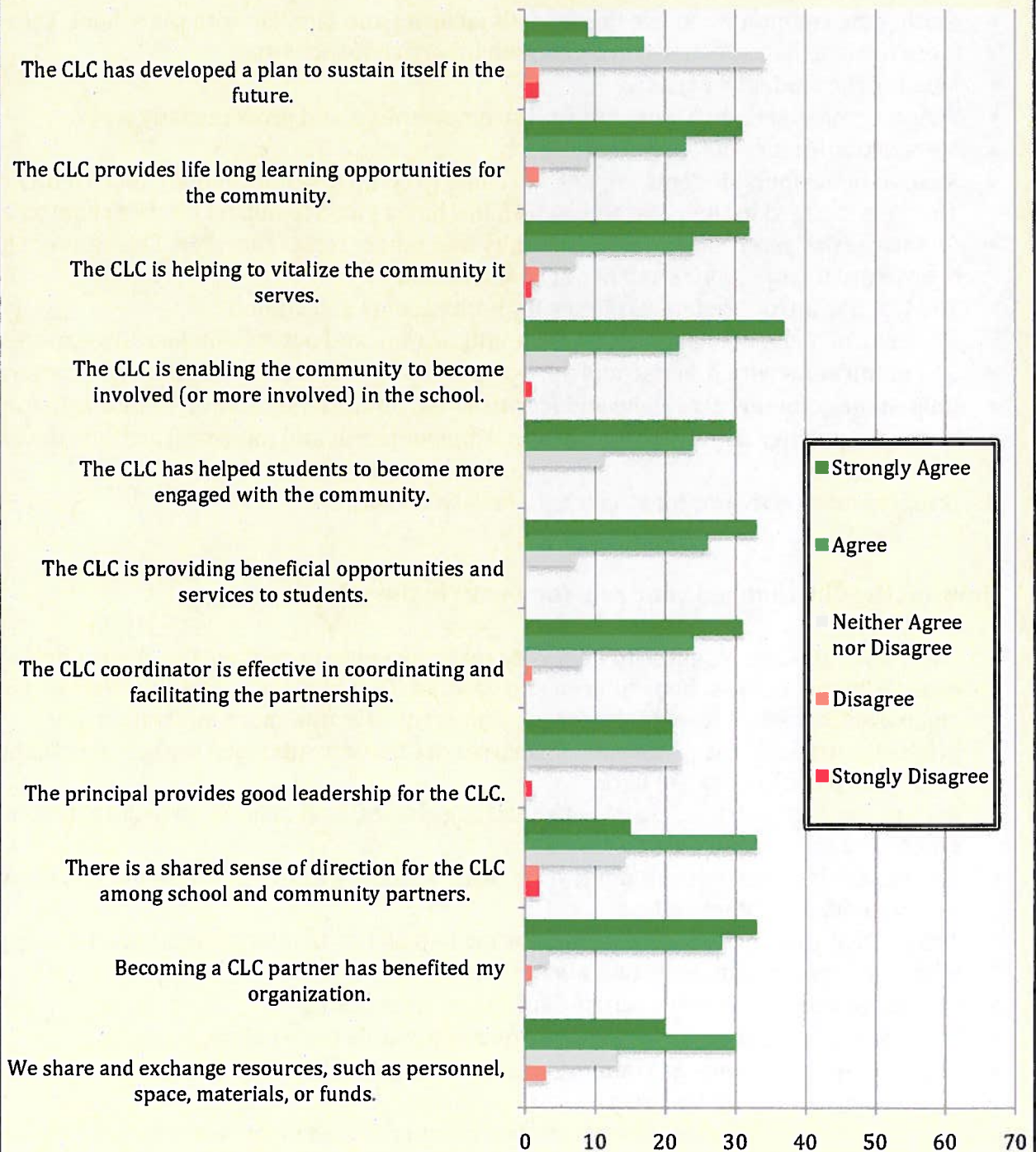

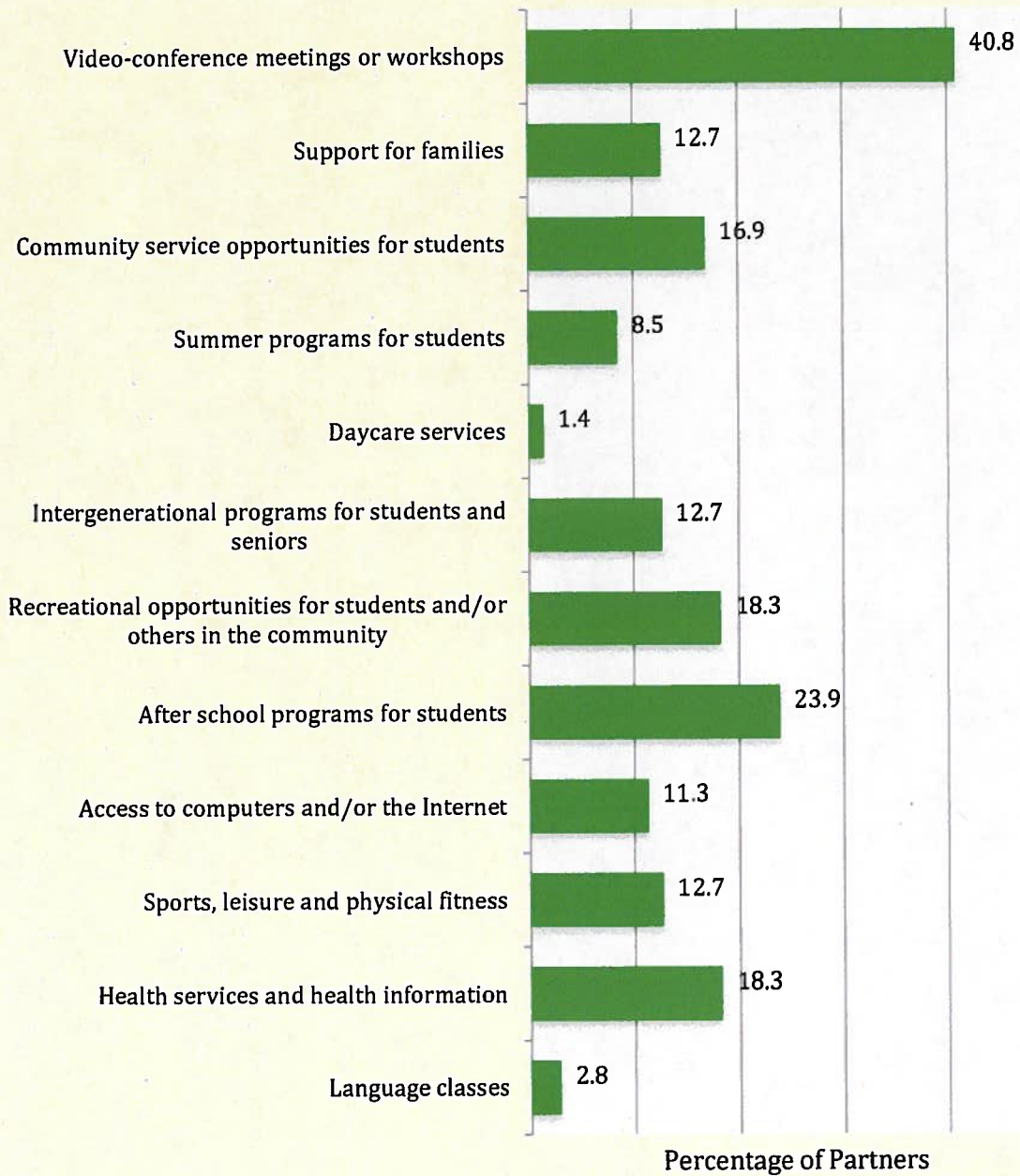
