Make your students accident prevention champions!

The CSST is endeavouring to make school-age children aware of the importance of accident prevention in their day-to-day activities.

Accident Prevention in Schools—two challenges, one essential condition: sustainability!

- ***Défi prévention jeunesse***: school projects focusing on accident prevention in daily life activities
- ***Sécurité Premier emploi***: school projects focusing on the world of work

You are invited, **along with your students**, to set up accident prevention projects in school and to foster the development of a culture of accident prevention.

DÉFI PRÉVENTION JEUNESSE

This Challenge is designed to help young people identify the risks associated with their daily activities and to make them more skilled at accident prevention through projects carried out in their school.

Who can participate?

If you operate a school daycare service or teach at the preschool, elementary or secondary level, you can submit up to five projects to the *Défi prévention jeunesse* on behalf of your school.

Why participate?

- To give young people the means they need to recognize and prevent risk situations for themselves and others
- To help young people adopt safe attitudes and behaviour
- To instil a culture of prevention in young people before they enter the labour market

SÉCURITÉ PREMIER EMPLOI

Sécurité Premier emploi is intended to make secondary school or vocational training students more aware of the risk of accidents in their first job and to give them the means to prevent such accidents from happening.

Who can participate?

If you teach in a secondary school or vocational training centre and wish to spark your students' interest in the prevention of work-related accidents, *Sécurité Premier emploi* is for you.

Why participate?

- To prepare young people to become agents of change with regard to health and safety in their future workplaces
- To encourage young people to think in terms of prevention and to promote their safety in their first job by carrying out an educational project in their school

Sustainability, an essential criterion!

In a spirit of sustainable development, the CSST encourages the adoption of good environmental practices through its financial assistance programs. This is why sustainability is now an essential condition for the eligibility of projects submitted as part of the *Éducation à la prévention en milieu scolaire* program.

All projects, regardless of the section they fall under, must be carried out in a way that shows respect for the environment.

- Use one form per project and present no more than one project per class. Each school is limited to five (5) projects.

Important dates to keep in mind

- November 30: Application deadline
- January 31: Deadline for providing schools with decisions respecting all projects submitted
- February 29: Deadline for granting financial assistance
- May 15: Deadline for the completion of projects in the schools

Don't wait until the end of the application period.
